### About Rasa String Quartet

The Rasa String Quartet explores the musical space where classical and folk traditions intersect and influence one another.

Based in Boston, they won the 2022 Associazione Europea Di Musica E Comunicazione International Chamber Music Competition and were the 2022-23 ensemble in residence at Phillips Exeter Academy.

By exploring connection between music and storytelling, the quartet delivers engaging, accessible programs that showcase works from many cultures. They seek to educate audiences by contextualizing the genres, styles, and composers they present, inviting listeners to approach familiar and unfamiliar sounds with an open, curious mind.

In Sanskrit, the term *rasa* refers to the indescribable power of any art form to inspire strong emotions in the reader or listener.

### About The Artists

Maura Shawn Scanlin, *violin*, *viola*, received a Masters Degree in Violin Performance from the Yale School of Music and a Bachelor's Degree from the New England Conservatory. Maura's classical collaborations with various ensembles have led her to the Fischoff International Chamber Music Competition, and the Yellow Springs Chamber Music Competition.

Particularly well-versed in Scottish and Irish traditional fiddle music, she is a two-time U.S. National Scottish Fiddling Champion, and a winner of the Glenfiddich Fiddle Championship in Perthshire, Scotland.

Maura enjoys teaching music as well. She has been on faculty at the Jink & Diddle School of Scottish Fiddling, the Heartbeat Music Project, Up With Music's Summer Strings and Hanneke Cassel's Pure Dead Brilliant Fiddle Weekend. She teaches at the Brookline Music School and privately throughout the year.

**Emma Kondo Powell,** *violin, viola,* is a New England based performer and educator. ## Old Ship Candlelight Concerts

The Candlelight concert series has been presented continuously within the historic First Parish Meeting House in Hingham since its founding some forty years ago. The concerts were inspired by an Old Ship family who, after a vacation trip to London, wished to encourage the organization of free concerts in Hingham similar to the tradition they experienced in the churches of Europe. The first concert was presented in December 1973 with a performance by the Cambridge Quartet.

The goal of these concerts is to present a wide variety of professional artists performing a breadth of instrumental and vocal repertory within this unique venue, which enhances the enjoyment of great musical art. The list of artists who have performed here includes many of the finest instrumental and vocal musicians from the New England and American music scene.

Performances take place in the Old Ship Meeting House at 90 Main Street in downtown Hingham. Designated in 1960 as a National Historic Landmark, and added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1966, this original Colonial building – the central portion was completed in 1681 – has been in continuous church use for more than 300 years. Observances in 2007 celebrated the 325th anniversary of the Meeting House.

The building, which has a capacity of more than 300 persons, is wheelchair-
